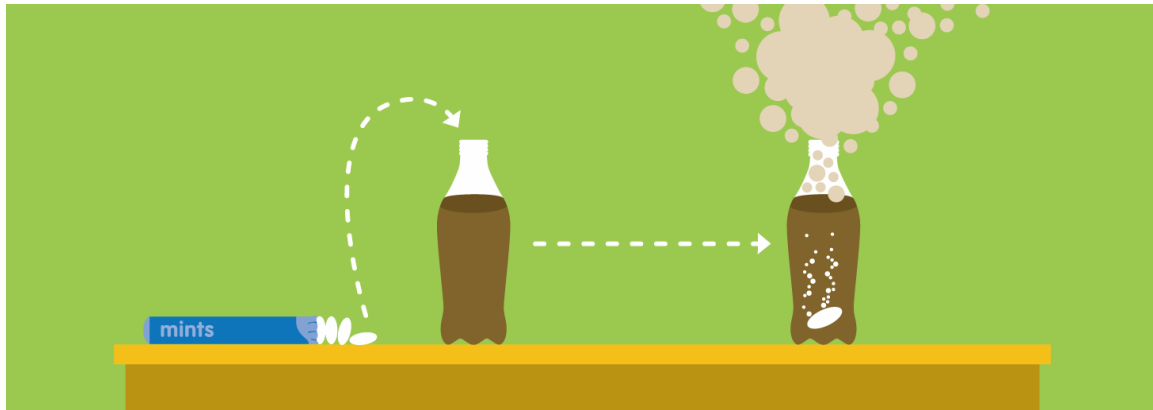




## Curiosity & Creativity
